Notes from the October/November Board meetings:

Treasurer's Report: (Sept & Oct) Beg. Bal 27,272.10; Income: \$1308.49; Expenses: \$2893.51 = Ending Bal: \$25,687.08

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Grant: The committee is now working on the Arts in the Military Grant, the Thrive Grant and the NM Arts grant, all coming due in the next couple of months. In Nov, the Board elected to enter into a contract with Steve Duffy, Las Cruces, who will be doing grant searches and grant writing. A Grant from the Otero Co. Co-op in the amount of \$1500.00 was received first of November. Volunteer: July to Sept = 254.5 hours.

Program: One of the points made during the discussion of upcoming events, especially the Kids Workshops is that we may have to invest in stronger tables for workshops and chairs that do not have to be wrapped each time.

Fundraising: Pennie Espiritu volunteered to be the Chair of the Fundraising Com..

Community Affiliations: The most active affiliation at this time continues to be Mainstreet Side Street project. OA produced a mural that was finished in late November. OA is being approached by other non-profit entites to develop partnerships, the latest being with the City of Alamogordo Tourism Dept.

Membership: Prior to the annual membership drive, we now have 110 members.

Art: Janet announced that Anne Aleshire will be the Artist Exhibitor for January.

Art Space Mgmt: Approved for purchase of a cart for the tables due to the heavy work setting up shows. There have been several rentals of the building; we need to continue advertising rental capacity. OLD BUSINESS: There is still no decision from the County on the

JR Willis paintings to be shown next spring. Chris Carson resigned from the Board because he has moved to Gallup.


NEW BUSINESS: A decision was made to purchase a piano for the Artspace.






