

10/21, 6 pm: Joan Price, MFA, will speak on the cultural identity and significance of a jaguar, the largest feline petroglyph at Three Rivers Petroglyph Site, a prehistoric gallery of thousands of petroglyphs managed by the BLM. Her talk is titled "Always Watching: A possible Axis Mundi at Three **Rivers Petroglyph Site."** The southern exposure of this depiction of a powerful hunter suggests it serves as a Guardian of the Southern Skies on original complex calendars of ceremonies and daily community activities.


## Nov. 11: VETERANS' DAY, 5 pm at the Artspace

Dr. Durand will be speaking on "Food and Feathers: What Archaeologists Can Learn about the Role of Animals in Prehistory."


This lecture is a replacement for the lecture cancelled due to weather in March.


