Join us for a unique civilian-military engagement to celebrate the arts in community \sim JUNE 2024

At the ARTSPACE ~ 12th and Indiana, Alamogordo NM

The Veteran Arts Showcase was founded by Dr. Lori Arella in 2013, an initiative of the Veteran Family Support Alliance, to assist with reintegration of troops returning to New York's Hudson Valley. It quickly became a vital celebration of artistic expression for hundreds of current and former members of the Armed Forces and their families. The Showcase offers a unique opportunity for veterans to reconnect with the larger community, and to discover new talents and parts of themselves – including ones unrelated to war. The Arts can offer hope when words alone may fail. Many veterans see themselves as "doers" rather than "talkers" and they often find activities that engage the right brain --like hiking, building, riding, gardening, the arts – far more appealing and effective in processing difficult life experiences than traditional "talk therapy."

Upon relocating to Otero County in 2017, Arella hoped to expand upon the Showcase experiences gained in NY, and in 2022 she assisted Otero Arts grant writer, Chris Jones, in obtaining a New Mexico Arts (NMA) grant to fund the first Veteran Arts Showcase in New Mexico. In May 2023, Otero Arts hosted an original play written by a local veteran, and a full day of art exhibits, a writers' workshop, performances and presentations by



and about local service members, veterans and their families. We have won another NMA grant to host our second Otero Arts Veteran Arts Showcase (OVAS), a month-long arts program of visual and performing arts, as well as public presentations and discussion. All exhibits and presentations are free to the public, and will take place in our beautiful gallery and performance venue, Otero Artspace in Alamogordo, NM, throughout the month of June 2024.




J. R. Willis and New Deal/WPA Photo Exhibition

The New Deal/WPA was a national effort to alleviate the suffering of the nation's huge number of unemployed workers during the Depression by creating work programs. Unemployed workers comprised skilled and unskilled laborers, artists, musicians, and writers.

New Mexico was one of the most active states during the New Deal Era. The New Deal Preservation Asso. collection comprises photographs of paintings, murals, sculptures and buildings constructed with WPA funds. The former Women's Club, now the Otero Artspace, is a good example of WPA building in NM.

A segment of this collection is on loan to Otero Arts for May to celebrate the 87th anniversery of the opening of the Women's Club on May 6, 1937. Included in the exhibition are 3 paintings by J.R. Willis, whose artwork was displayed at the 1937 opening.





The Opening Reception Exhibition will be **Friday, May 3** from 5 to 7 pm at the Artspace.

The gallery will be open from 1 to 4 every Thursday through Sunday in May.

Since becoming Thrive in Southern New Mexico in 2017, the organization raised more than \$3 million by 2022 to support Otero and Lincoln County non-profit organizations. Up until 2017, Thrive was United Way of Otero County. A large portion of the donations came at the beginning from Gerald Champion Med. Center employees who donated more than \$200K from 2020 to 2022. Another big contributor is Otero County Electric Co-op. Donations go to local non-profits including local churches, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Boys and Girls Club and senior centers. Otero Arts has been awarded a Thrive

Grant for the coming year for the first time. The amount granted to OA has yet to be announced, but it will fund our educational services including free art workshops for children and adults through our program called "Art for All Ages Workshops".


